***Discussion Starter Questions***  
*January 10, 2021*

1. Jesus was submissive to Father as well as government and religious authorities. The Bible praises the virtue of submissiveness. Yet, many people seem to resist being submissive. Why do you think many of us resist being submissive, especially in our families?
2. Paul wrote that we are to *submit to one another out of reverence for Christ* (Ephesians 5:21). How does that address the reasons and excuses that people give for not being submissive?
3. Submissive starts with a humble spirit. How do you practice humility?
4. People are often afraid to relinquish their rights and privileges. What are we afraid of?
5. Submission is not easy and often comes at a cost. What are some costs you might have to endure to be submissive?
6. What does honoring people who are over us look like?
7. Jesus Christ, the Creator and Master of the Universe, lived a submissive human life. As His disciple, what do you learn from Him that will help you follow His example?
