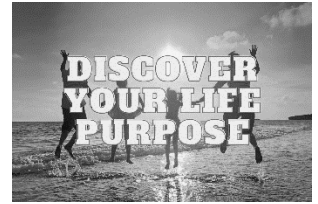


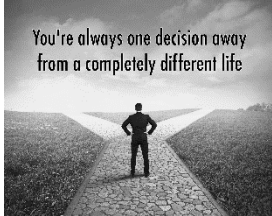
Sunday AM Sermon – December 4, 2022
